SACRAMENT OF COMMUNION

ONE: Heaven declares God's glory.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Introduction

Following the tradition of Jesus who welcomed children into his community, we celebrate the presence of children within this community of faith and offer to children the sacrament of baptism.

As we invite Kari and Mike to come forward to celebrate the sacrament of baptism, we acknowledge the religious traditions they bring with them. Finding a path between the tradition of infant baptism and the personal profession of faith at confirmation in The United Church of Canada tradition, affords a unique opportunity to identify the particular faith being expressed here this day.

Questions of the Parents/Family

Do you desire to have your child baptized into this Christian community?

Will you encourage your child to learn from the wisdom of the prophets; doing justice, loving mercy, and walking humbly with her God?

Will you foster for your child an appreciation for the life and teachings of Jesus?

Will you teach your child to honour the faith questions that belong to her throughout her life?

Will you journey with your child to discover the wonder of God's love made manifest here this day and to be part of a faith community?

Congregational Assent

Jesus calls us to welcome children into the full life of our community, opening our table and hearts to those most vulnerable, offering the wisdom of the ages to all who hunger for truth.

The gospels testify that all people are invited to accept God, the God who has already accepted us. We only need to accept that we are accepted.

All: So, we, the members of God's beloved community, proclaim that same witness. Gwyneth, the same God who has claimed every

person as a beloved child, also proclaims that you are a beloved child.

As a community, do you vow to support them in their promises?

All: We do, with the help of God. We also promise to walk with Gwyneth on her spiritual journey. On this holy adventure with God, we will celebrate our beloved kinship, live out God's vision for the world, and embody God's Kin-dom.

Baptismal Prayer

We thank you, God, for the gift of creation made known to us in water and word. Before the world had shape and form, your Spirit moved over the waters. Out of the waters of the deep, you formed the firmament and brought forth the earth to sustain all life.
